CUBA



In February, our Cuba Co-Director's welcomed a delegation of 10 people focusing on Pan-Africanism and the African diaspora's experience in Cuba. Students, teachers, researchers and organizers who identify as Black, hailing from various regions in the U.S, British Guyana and Puerto Rico, came together to explore the influence of historical Haitian immigration into Cuba; religious syncretism; feminist and black-pride efforts at the neighborhood level; the successful referendum which brought into law a vanguard Family Code protecting the rights of elders, children and LGBTQ Cubans; efforts to eliminate racial bias in healthcare access; among others. Delegates also visited the historical city of Trinidad, a hub for sugar production up until XIX century, learning about the footprint of enslaved people in today's culture, architecture and religious practices in the area. To tie all this together, the delegation reflected on what all these lessons mean for the struggle for Black liberation in the U.S.



HONDURAS



This past month, Honduras team, through their involvement with the Honduran Solidarity Network (HSN), supported the launch a the campaign "Putting the US & Canada On Trial" with the objective of holding the U.S. and Canada responsible for their complicity in bolstering the Juan Orlando Hernandez narco-regime. We are working in coalition with organizations in Canada, and the U.S. to contact Canadian Members of Parliament and U.S. Congressional representatives to demand investigations into the role of our governments in backing the narco-state in Honduras. To support our campaign as an individual or an organization, please join our sign on action below! In addition, the Honduras team went on a human rights accompaniment to the Bajo Aguan region, where we witnessed the increased risks to campesinx land defenders, after two separate murder attempts and the kidnapping of a campesino cooperative member. Lastly, our Honduras team led a protection workshop with grassroots land defenders & Indigenous leaders to facilitate the creation of community-led protection plans.



COLOMBIA



The WFPSC Colombia team, alongside Communities Building Peace in Colombia (CONPAZCOL), stood in solidarity with the family and community members of Phanor Guazaquillo Peña. Phanor, a Nasa social leader and member of the Board of Directors of CONPAZCOL, was tragically assassinated on December 3, 2023, in Puerto Asís, Putumayo. We continue to honor his legacy and advocate for justice.

Also the WFPSC Colombia team, in collaboration with 42 other peace building organizations forming part of The Space of Cooperation for Peace (Espacio de Cooperación para la Paz), issued a compelling call for the resumption of peace negotiations between the Colombian government and the ELN. This call, integral to the larger Total Peace plan, has garnered attention from major Colombian media outlets such as El Espectador. Our thoughts and support are with Briceida Lemos, a courageous individual who participated in a WFPSC organized Speaker's tour in the U.S. last November. We would like to share our deepest gratitude to everyone who supported Briceida in seeking funds to undergo cancer treatment. This support has really been fundamental in the treatment Briceida has received so far. Our team had the privilege of meeting Briceida both at La Elvira farm with her family and at a hospital where she is undergoing treatment for late-stage cancer. We stand in solidarity with Briceida in her tireless efforts for the defense of territory and the construction of peace in the campesina communities of Miranda and northern Cauca.



The former Honduran President, Juan Orlando Hernández, a long-time U.S. ally will soon go to trial in New York on drug-trafficking charges. Demand that his allies, the US and Canada, be held accountable for their role in the narcostate in Honduras.







ROOT CAUSE OF MIGRATION AUGUST 1-10, 2024

This delegation will focus on US-backed militarism in Honduras and its negative impact on communities struggling against the climate crisis by contextualizing the root causes of climate will directly migration. Delegates learn from frontline communities and organizations centering the experiences of Indigenous and campesino people who are witnesses and victims of hyper-militarism and who are at risk of being displaced because of climate aggravation. This delegation intends to spread awareness of how militarism exacerbates the climate crisis which harms the living conditions of Indigenous and campesino communities.
